# TO VOTE IN NEBRASKA

- **✓** You must be a United States citizen.
- You must be 18 years of age or older on General Election Day.
- ✓ You must be a resident of Nebraska.

**Lawmakers pay attention to people** who vote in their districts.

- Nobody can tell you how to vote.
- Vote for issues you care about.
- Vote for candidates who support issues that matter to you.

### **QUICK VOTING FACTS**

- √ If you have a Guardian... People with a Guardian, Payee, or
  - Conservator can still vote unless a judge has specifically taken that right away.
- √ You can ask for help. You can vote by yourself or with help from a friend, family member, or polling

place worker.

- **Voting is free.** It does not cost anything to vote or to register to vote.
- Vote by mail or in person. You can complete your ballot at home and mail it in OR go to your polling place to vote.
- If you have been convicted of a felony...

You can register to vote if you've finished your sentence or parole.

√ You will need to show photo ID to vote.

You can get a free State ID card.

If you live in a facility... People who live in group homes and facilities have a right to vote!
