TO VOTE IN NEBRASKA YOU MUST:

- Be a United States citizen.
- Be 18 years of age or older on General Election Day.
- Be a resident of Nebraska.

YOU CANNOT REGISTER TO VOTE IF:

- You have been convicted of a felony. If convicted, it must have been at least two (2) years since you completed your sentence, including parole, before you are able to register to vote.
- You have been declared by a court to be mentally incompetent to vote.



Early Voting Deadlines

You may apply for an Early Voting Ballot up to 120 days before a statewide Primary or General election.

Early voting ballots must be requested by 6:00 PM on the 2nd Friday before the election.

Voters will not receive and cannot vote on an Early Voting Ballot until 35 days before a statewide election or 15 days before a city election.

Early Voting Ballots must be cast the Monday before Election Day if voting in person at the Election office.

The Election Office must receive Early Voting Ballots by 8:00 PM on Election Day if the ballot is cast by mail.
